25. Delicia Bravo Aguilar and Peter Wigginton serve as the coordinators for the Ecuador Partnership. Pray for them and the people of Ecuador as gang violence continues to increase, creating fear and violence throughout the country (p. 30).

26. In January, Mission Network staff and mission workers serving in Latin America gathered for a retreat near La Mesa, Colombia. Praise God for an enriching and encouraging time, as these families were able to meet and share about their ministries with others who have similar experiences.

27. Pray for the Tokyo Anabaptist Center, a joint effort of Brethren in Christ and Mennonite denominations in Japan, to provide resources to people interested in Anabaptist theology and practice (p. 20).

28. Pray for Mission Network partner Church of Christ in Thailand District 20 Hmong as they facilitate ministries within the Hmong communities throughout Thailand and around the world (p. 21).

29. Ben and Laurel Woodward-Breckbill, and their two children, are wrapping up their first two-year mission term at the Paris (France) Mennonite Center and will begin their second term soon. Pray for clarity as they plan their next term, and pray that their family would be able to find time for rest and connection (p. 26).

30. Praise God with the Alamosa, Colorado, MVS unit for the support of the community of former MVSers, placement agency staff and church members they are surrounded by. Pray that these participants continue to feel this support as they continue through the MVS program (p. 40).

1. Pray for the people of the United States, as the country is experiencing deep division, which has led to violence and fear for many. Pray for peace, justice and an end to the extreme discord.
2. For the next five days, the Anchorage, Alaska, and Colorado Springs, Colorado, Service Adventure units will be gathering in San Angelo, Texas, to serve with Mennonite Disaster Service. Pray for a great week of serving and learning together, as well as safe travels for the participants as they travel back to their respective units on March 6 (p. 42).
3. South Africa's education system is experiencing a crisis of severe underfunding, understaffing and registration issues, which has led to many teachers managing classrooms of 60+ students. Join SADRA Conflict Transformation, a Mennonite Mission Network partner in South Africa, in praying that the community and government can work together to develop practical solutions to avoid harm to learners and mitigate the community conflicts that may arise from this situation (p. 13).
4. After months of acclimating themselves to the language and culture of Guatemala, Seth and Stephany Rudeen have begun teaching at the Q'eqchi' Bezaleel Mennonite Educational Center. Pray for Stephany as she has taken on the unexpected role of teaching English full time, and pray for Seth as he learns the skills needed to help teach math classes, with the added difficulty of doing so in a language he is not yet fluent in (p. 31).

- 5.** Joseph and Rachel Givens, and their two sons, have been serving migrants at the Maria Skobtsova House in Calais, France, since 2022. The government in Calais is not friendly to migrants. Pray that the Givens will have success in uniting compassionate locals with the migrant community at the Maria Skobtsova House (p. 23).
- 6.** As the mission agency of Mennonite Church USA, Mennonite Mission Network acts as a bridge for Mennonite congregations to participate in global mission work. Pray for devoted individuals and families to join us in accompanying the marginalized, building partnerships and sharing hope in a broken world.
- 7.** Caleb and Stephanie Schrock-Hurst arrived in Hualien, Taiwan, last month, where they are supporting Mennonite Christian Hospital. Pray for them as they settle into their new homes, acclimate to the language and familiarize themselves with the hospital (p. 16).
- 8.** On this International Women's Day, pray that women across the street and around the world feel empowered to live out their faith in meaningful ways, despite any negative pressures they may feel from patriarchal systems in their homes, communities, churches and countries.
- 9.** Jonah and Memee Yang offer trainings in Southeast Asia, with a focus on discipleship, equipping youth and families, and holistic community building. Pray for Jonah, as he teaches Anabaptist Mennonite Biblical Seminary's Journey Missional Leadership Development program, and for Memee, as she works with women using the Sister Care curriculum (p. 17).
- 10.** Praise God with the Africa Leadership Coaching Network and Africa Inter-Mennonite Mission that, in January, 36 young women from the Democratic Republic of Congo, who had previously been seen as having little value by society, were able to graduate with training in sewing and tailoring, and hairdressing and beauty services. Pray for these women as they begin to generate income for themselves and their children (p. 11).
- 11.** During this Women's History Month, pray for the witness of the Movimiento de Mujeres Anabaptistas haciendo Teología desde América Latina, as they spread theological literacy and the love of Christ throughout Latin America, through seminars and devotionals (p. 36).
- 12.** Christliche Dienste is the learning and service program for German Mennonite youth that partners with Mission Network's Mennonite Voluntary Service. Pray for this international exchange that broadens the faith of the German participants and their counterparts from the United States and other countries (p. 26).
- 13.** Colleen and Pablo Fast have been serving in Brazil for more than 30 years. Praise God that the Brazilian churches they serve with are experiencing a time of growth, with multiple families being sent out to plant more churches and the already-established churches increasing the number of services they offer (p. 31).
- 14.** The Service Adventure house in Anchorage, Alaska, expresses gratitude for the Prince of Peace Mennonite Church members who have been supportive and encouraging to them, while spending time with them. Pray that participants and the church community continue to support one another, as the Service Adventure participants continue their involvement in Sunday worship times (p. 42).
- 15.** Laura Schlabach served in Mongolia with JCS International for 32 years. She concluded that ministry at the end of 2025 and has spent the past three months traveling to congregations and other supporters to give her final updates. This month will mark the end of her work with Mission Network. Pray for her as she moves into retirement and re-establishes her life outside of Mongolia.
- 16.** Mission Network's ABIDE team is committed to anti-racism, belonging, inclusion, diversity and equity. Pray for wisdom for leaders, courage for those they accompany, provision for grants and initiatives, and open hearts across congregations to join in promoting anti-racism and inclusion.
- 17.** Laura and Nick Sharp, and their two children, began serving at Colegio Americano Menno in La Mesa, Colombia, last year. Praise God that they have been integrating well into their new community and culture (p. 32).
- 18.** The Nigerian Anabaptist Peace Center/ Resource Center, a Mission Network partner, trains pastors and church planters in peacebuilding within the Middle Belt region of Nigeria. Pray for their peace witness of as they spread the good news of Jesus to the people of Nigeria (p. 12).
- 19.** Anicka Fast and her family are based in the Netherlands, where Anicka continues to use her expertise in church history and missiology to mentor and train church historians. Pray for her as she strengthens her students' archiving skills through online and in-person consultations. Pray also for her family as they prepare to move to Canada later this year (p. 23).
- 20.** In the midst of the war in Gaza, Bethlehem Bible College continues to work toward its mission of being a Palestinian Christian Evangelical learning community that prepares leaders to serve locally and globally. Pray that these students, and all of us, will have the courage to work for peace (p. 13).
- 21.** Jae Young Lee and Karen Spicher live and work at the Peace Building Community with their five children. Pray for them as they engage with the Northeast Asia Regional Peacebuilding Institute, Korea Peacebuilding Institute and Korea Association for Restorative Justice, in addition to parenting their children (p. 15).
- 22.** Beginning today, a group of 11 people from Columbus (Ohio) Mennonite Church will embark on a seven-day Underground Railroad Just Peace Pilgrimage. Pray for participants as they encounter difficult realities that may shift and challenge their worldview, and pray that they are able to use the insights they gain from this experience to help effect positive change in their own lives and home community (p. 39).
