

24. Mennonite Mission Network acts as a bridge for Mennonite congregations to participate in global mission work. Pray that God strengthens that vital connection, inspiring more individuals, families and churches to participate in the shared call to prayer, giving, sending and welcoming returned servants.

25. Toni and Matthew Krabill serve in Ghana and are engaged in many ministries across West Africa. Pray for them as work with The Sanneh Institute, churches and communities in Ghana and the Center for the Formation of Justice and Peace in Ivory Coast (p. 10).

26. Iziko Lamaqabane is a network of people, churches and organizations in South Africa who are committed to living a radical lifestyle of reconciliation. They work to support and grow communities of peace, justice and reconciliation together (p. 13).

27. Kate Widmer serves at La Prairie Church of Montbéliard, France. A large part of her ministry is working with women and young girls from the church and surrounding neighborhood. She helps host a language-learning Bible study, sewing classes, kids' clubs and a middle school girls' group. Pray for these ministries, as she spreads the love of Christ through her interactions with the community (p. 25).

28. Friedenshaus (House of Peace) is a ministry of the Mennonite church in Ludwigshafen, Germany, that focuses on bringing a culture of peace to their community by providing refugees with language acquisition assistance and other services (pp. 27-28).

29. Ben and Laurel Woodward-Breckbill are serving as the directors of the Paris (France) Mennonite Center. They and their two children will soon be traveling back to the United States for their two-month North American Ministry. Pray for them as they spend July visiting churches and supporters on a cross-country road trip and August in Kansas (p. 26).

30. Aliança Evangélica Menonita (AEM) is an alliance of around 40 Portuguese-speaking churches in six regions of Brazil. Pray for AEM, as they work to establish Sister Care teams in each of the regions they serve (p. 34).

1. Laura and Nick Sharp, and their two children, are nearing the end of their time in Colombia. Pray for this family as they navigate the difficulties of leaving behind the friends and culture they have grown to love, while also eagerly anticipating being reunited with their friends, family and home in Kansas (p. 32).

2. Delicia Bravo Aguilar's mother, Federica, suffered a hemorrhagic stroke in March and is on the path to recovery. Delicia and Peter Wigginton request continued prayer for her healing, as well as prayer for a smooth transition back into normalcy as Delicia returns to Ecuador, after spending time with Federica in Bolivia (p. 30).

3. This month, the participants in the Colorado Springs, Colorado, Service Adventure unit will complete their individual service placements, go on their year-end trip and end their term together. Pray that this final month will be a fulfilling time of fellowship and work (p. 42).

4. The Anabaptist Association of Australia and New Zealand (AAANZ) supports Anabaptists in Australia and New Zealand by providing teachings, trainings, pastoral care, mediation and counseling. Additionally, AAANZ helps connect congregations and organizations to help build community and share resources. Pray for AAANZ, as they help encourage Anabaptists in their region (p. 21).

5. Today is World Environment Day. Pray that all God's people would see the value in preserving and protecting the world God made for us through action and activism. Pray for an end to the destruction of wildlife habitats, nature preserves, jungles and forests, sacred lands, and other places of natural significance.

- 6.** Little Eden's Justice and Peace Centre is an organization that works with at-risk youth in Botswana. Pray for this ministry as it seeks to rehabilitate, educate and train children in healthy and safe living practices (p. 11).
- 7.** A mission worker who is serving in Nepal unexpectedly lost her mother in late April. Pray for her, her husband and her four children, as they process her death (p. 16).
- 8.** Today, SOOP participants Carolyn and Enos Tice begin a two-week placement at Crooked Creek Christian Camp in Washington, Iowa. Pray that this experience would be a blessing to the camp staff, campers and the Tices (p. 43).
- 9.** The Council of Indigenous Evangelical Peoples and Organizations (FEINE), in Ecuador, is currently working to effect change in the services their government offers its people. FEINE is calling for reform in healthcare, education, security and fuel pricing. Pray that their efforts influence those in power to take the necessary steps to provide a safe and peaceful environment for the people of Ecuador (p. 35).
- 10.** As the Anchorage, Alaska, Service Adventure unit approaches the longest day of the year — on June 21, they will experience 22 hours of functional daylight! — and nears the end of the service year, pray that this final month together would be fruitful, encouraging and full of plenty of time outdoors enjoying the long summer days (p. 42).
- 11.** Caleb and Stephanie Schrock-Hurst have completed their formal Mandarin language study and are now moving on to working full time at the Mennonite Christian Hospital in Hualien, Taiwan. Pray for them as they transition into this full-time work and continue their language study independently and through conversations with colleagues (p. 16).
- 12.** The Brethren in Christ Church in the United Kingdom has 10 congregations, made up of mostly Zimbabwean members. Pray for them as they live out their Anabaptist theology in a new land (p. 27).
- 13.** The Chinese Anabaptist Network is a network of people who want to learn more about Anabaptist theology and live out its values. Pray for them as they pursue a faith that is often difficult to practice within their context (p. 18).
- 14.** Christy Harrison and Peter Sensenig serve on the Muslim-Christian relations team in Montbéliard, France. They and their three children are living in France temporarily, as they assess their next steps in ministry. Pray for them through this discernment process and as they minister to immigrants with the La Prairie Church (p. 24).
- 15.** Key Ministry International South Africa serves migrant communities in Pietmaritzburg, through socio-economic and psychosocial interventions, such as peace clubs. Pray that their witness would bring hope and peace to the communities they serve (p. 13).
- 16.** The Argentina Chaco Global Mission Partnership supports the long-term ministry of the Mennonite Team of the Argentine Chaco. One of the primary focuses of this ministry is to provide Scripture in Indigenous languages, through translation projects, oral histories, Bible studies and a learning center. Pray for this ministry and Alfonsina Finger and José Oyanguren, who help support it (pp. 31, 33).
- 17.** On Friday, College Mennonite Church, from Goshen, Indiana, will begin a one-week Civil Rights Just Peace Pilgrimage. Pray that participants will have open hearts and minds as they encounter the realities of widespread racial disparities and injustices in the United States. Pray also for the many people they will meet on their journey, who will take their time to share their first-hand experiences (p. 39).
- 18.** Seth and Stephany Rudeen will complete their year in Guatemala soon. Pray that they are able to stay present with the students of the Bezaleel school, while they eagerly look ahead to what God has in store for them in the United States (p. 31).
- 19.** Today, the United States celebrates Juneteenth, the anniversary of the day when the enslaved people of Galveston, Texas, finally learned of their freedom, two years after this freedom was granted to them through the Emancipation Proclamation. Pray that, unlike the original Juneteenth, justice would come quickly to all who are oppressed and that the joy of the news would reach them swiftly.
- 20.** The Taiwan Mennonite New Dawn Educare Center provides training and resources for people with intellectual disabilities. Recently, they received support from two local business owners, who provided resource matching for their farm's egg-selling operation. Pray that this momentum will continue and the community will provide additional support as they help people learn self-reliance (p. 21).
- 21.** Today, as people in the United States celebrate the father figures in their lives, pray that those who do not have a father to celebrate with will find solace in the love and sacrifice that our heavenly parent has freely given to all.
- 22.** Praise God for a productive time of learning and reflection for the MVS unit in Tucson, Arizona, this spring. They explored vocation with MVS alum Ally Weaver and joined with others from Shalom Mennonite at the San Xavier Mission for a time of reflection and learning around the theme, "From Mission Walls to Border Walls: Deconstructing Postcolonial Narratives." Pray that they are able to close their time together in meaningful ways (p. 41).
- 23.** A couple has served in India since 2013. Pray for their ministries of rural and tribal social service outreach, through providing for the basic, medical and spiritual needs to those in the Andhra Pradesh Region (p. 16).
